**AN ACT TO AUTHORISE SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION OF MONIES
OUT OF THE CONSOLIDATED FUND FOR RECURRENT EXPENDITURE
FOR THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING 31 DECEMBER 1996**

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (No. 3) Act 1996.

Authorisation of issue of \$999,058 from the Consolidated Fund

2. The issue from the Consolidate Fund is hereby authorised of a sum of \$999,058 to be applied for recurrent expenditure to the service of the year ending 31 December 1996.

Appropriation

3. The sum specified in Section 2 shall be appropriated for the supply of the Heads of Expenditure specified in Column 1 of the Schedule annexed to this Act in the sums respectively specified in relation thereto in Column 2 of the Schedule.

SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (NO.3) ACT 1996

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1. This Act seeks to charge upon the Consolidated Fund a sum, which is required for recurrent expenditure for the year ending 31 December 1996, in addition to the amount appropriated for that year by the Appropriation Act 1996 (No. 1 of 1996), and the Supplementary Appropriation Act 1996 (No. 2 of 1996) and the Supplementary Appropriation Act 1996 (No. 8 of 1996).
2. The sum required is to provide for money expended in excess of sums already appropriated.
3. The Act provides that the additional amount charged shall be expended upon the service listed in the Schedule to the Act.
4. This Act is presented to the Maneaba ni Maungatabu in accordance with the requirements of Section 109(3) of the Constitution.
