In response, the reconstruction of the crescent seawall at Rawannawi is a coastal protection measure that the Government has not yet implemented on any island due to limited technical expertise within the responsible ministry. However, the Government, through the relevant ministry, is committed to exploring international firms with proven expertise in this type of seawall construction. This will enable a comprehensive technical assessment and the development of a sustainable design for the new crescent seawall.

The non-payment of leave grant for pre-school teachers in 2024 is due to the need for a thorough scrutiny of names, ID number, bank details to ensure that there is no double payment to one teacher and the correct amount is paid to individual teachers since some teachers do not work within a given year, while others commence work in the middle of the year or towards the end of the year. A thorough assessment and verification are required in line with the Financial Regulations. Now that all has been done, I am pleased to say that the disbursement of leave grants for pre-school teachers is currently in progress.
